Quick reference guide for Visitors of Kings Langley School

As an adult visiting this school **YOU** have a duty to act when you have a concern about the childs welfare.

This leaflet has been given to you to make sure you understand what is expected of you (please keep it in a safe place). Please seek advice from your **Designated Senior Leader for Child Protection** if you are unclear about anything in this leaflet.

If you would like to access the school's guest WiFi you are bound by the school's E-Safety and Data Security Guidance Policy. The access is fully secure and will prevent you from browsing, downloading, uploading or distributing any material that could be considered offensive, illegal or discriminatory. Please ensure that whilst you are on the school site, your online activity does not bring your organisation or professional role into disrepute. You have a duty to report any E-Safety incident which may impact on you, your professionalism or your organisation. Please ask at Reception for further access information.

- Delays in reporting your concerns can cause the child greater harm.
- Adults in school are often the first people to see a child after they have been abused.
