A note from the Deputy Headteacher -Mrs Sudbury

- There are two contingency dates, on the afternoon of Wednesday 11th June 2025 and all day on Wednesday 25th June 2025. These are in place to allow for any sustained national or local disruption that may arise during the exam period, and it is important that all Year 11 and 13 students are available on these dates in case any exams need to be rescheduled.
- Information about study leave, and other important dates, is being shared with Year 11 and 13 parents and students in a separate letter being emailed this week.
- We know that social media is a big part of many students' lives but it is very important that they understand what is allowed/what is not allowed when using social media in their revision and exam preparation. Students must not use social media to:

- buy/ask for/share exam or assessment content on rumours of what's in exams or assessments;
- share their work; or with others so that their exam or assessment is not their own independent work.


Doing any of these activities could result in a written warning; loss of marks; being disqualified from a part of, or all of, their qualifications; or being banned from taking exams and assessments for a number of years.







DRAMA HOUSE COMPETITION





This summer production is a play called THE MIRACLE. The main character is a girl called Veronica (or Ron) who finds one day, after a flood, that she has "powers" to read people and tell them how to make themselves feel better. The community of the town have mixed feelings about this. Many want her help, but the adults especially are sceptical.

Once again we are running a competition to design a front cover for the programme to be used for the show. It needs to be A4 and portrait orientation and must include the following:

End of Year Exhibition'25

Talent shines bright at a celebration of photographic creativity.

The 2025 KLSix A-Level Photography End of Year Exhibition was a resounding success, drawing an exceptional turnout and garnering widespread praise for the calibre and originality of the student work on display.

Held in the school's purpose-built photography studio space, the event saw a vibrant mix of attendees, including proud friends and families, local art enthusiasts, gallery owners, staff and members of the governing body. The atmosphere was electric as visitors explored a wide-ranging exhibition featuring conceptual installation work, documentary photography, and experimental photographic works that tackled themes such as identity, climate anxiety, self-identity, and social pressures.

A major highlight of the evening was the presence of internationally renowned photographer **Vernon Dewhurst**, best known for his iconic work with surrealist and pop culture imagery. Dewhurst, who mingled with students and offered feedback on their portfolios, praised the exhibition for its "authentic voice and visual maturity well beyond the students' years."

"This kind of creative space is rare and important," Dewhurst remarked. "The confidence and craftsmanship shown by these young photographers is truly exciting. It speaks to the



strength of the teaching here and the students' courage to explore difficult and personal subjects."




