### A note from the Headteacher

It gives me great pleasure in sharing with you the report of our Section 8 inspection by Ofsted that took place on 12 and 13 March 2024, Kings Langley School continues to be a good school.

Ofsted reports are word limited and heavily quality assured, but despite this, our report manages to convey the richness of the school and how impressed the team were with us.

I wanted to draw your attention to the following feedback we received:

- Pupils enjoy attending school. Staff know pupils well.
  Pupils benefit from warm and positive relationships. This supports them to be confident to share how they feel and seek support when they need it. Pupils know that staff are there to help them. This helps pupils to feel happy and safe.
- All pupils, including students in the sixth form learn about what good character is. They do this through the school's effective character development programme. This teaches pupils about how to make positive choices. As a result, pupils independently behave in a calm and civilised way.

- Reading is a real strength of the school. Those pupils at the earlier stages of reading get precisely targeted support to help them catch up. All pupils are encouraged to read widely. Teachers carefully consider how the texts they use further develop pupils' comprehension. As a result, pupils become confident and fluent readers.
- Pupils enjoy a wealth of personal development opportunities. This includes activities week at the end of the school year. This brings everyone together. Every child has a meaningful opportunity to be a leader. Leadership roles include wildlife, sports, diversity and inclusion, music and the school council. There is something for everyone to be involved with.
- Pupils receive effective careers guidance, across the school to help them make the best choices to support their next steps. For example, sixth form students who wish to apply for prestigious apprenticeships or universities get highly useful additional support. As a result, many students are successful in achieving places.
- The school has carefully thought through and planned the knowledge pupils should learn in each subject. The school has ensured that its curriculum planning is ambitious and builds the complexity of what pupils learn over time. For example, in mathematics when pupils join the school, they revisit their understanding of numbers. This ensures they have the foundations needed to study algebra. By sixth form, students have the skills to understand more complex mathematical concepts.

# **Sixth Form Applications**

#### September 2024 Entry

With the arrival of a brand new building and relaunched Sixth Form at Kings Langley we are excited to report that applications for September 2024 are at a record high with over 250 applications submitted this year.

We are excited to see the development of our Sixth Form and are already enjoying the journey towards becoming Hertfordshire's number one Sixth Form provider. With a diverse A-Level subject offer alongside an engaging curriculum that firmly promotes equality and belonging we look forward to students enrolling with us on results day this summer.

We prioritise our own Yr11 students in the application process as well as offering places to a growing number of external applicants. Students will be receiving offer letters this week outlining the status of their application.

#### **Internal students:**

#### **Conditional offer + priority subject offer**

Students who have indicated that Kings Langley Sixth Form is their 1st choice provider will receive this letter and will receive priority subject access on GCSE results day. Students will have priority enrolment up to 3pm on GCSE results day for their subject choice.

#### **Conditional offer**

Students will receive this letter if they have applied for Kings Langley Sixth Form but where we are not their first choice provider. Students can enrol for their subject choice from 3pm on GCSE results day.

#### Application pending

Students may receive this letter if their predicted grades indicate that they will not meet the entry criteria for the Sixth Form or for the subject combinations applied for.

#### **External students:**

#### **Conditional offer**

Students who have indicated Kings Langley Sixth Form as their first choice provider and who meet our admissions policy will receive a conditional offer. Students will be able to enrol with us from GCSE results day.

#### **Application pending**

Students who have applied for Kings Langley Sixth Form but who have not indicated if we are their first choice provider will receive this letter. Students who have applied for subjects which are oversubscribed may also receive this letter. Students will be able to enrol at Kings Langley Sixth Form from 3pm-5pm on GCSE results day.

#### **Clearing:**

Students who have not applied for Kings Langley Sixth Form but who subsequently change their mind and wish to enrol at Kings Langley Sixth Form after our enrolment, can check subject availability on our website in our clearing section.
