#### Character of the Week: Cher Ami, Carrier Pigeon in World War 1

On October 3, 1918, Major Whittlesey and more than 500 men were trapped in a small depression on the side of the hill. Surrounded by enemy soldiers, many were killed and wounded on the first day. By the second day, only a little more than 200 men were still alive or unwounded.

Major Whittlesey sent out several pigeons to tell his commanders where he was, and how bad the trap was. The next afternoon he had only one pigeon left, Cher Ami.

During the afternoon, the American Artillery tried to send some protection by firing hundreds of big artillery rounds into the ravine where the Germans surrounded Major Whittlesey and his men. Unfortunately, the American commanders didn't know exactly where

the American soldiers were and started dropping the big shells right on top of them. It was a horrible situation that might have resulted in Major Whittlesey and all his men getting killed by their own army.

Major Whittlesey called for his last pigeon, Cher Ami. He wrote a quick and simple note, telling the men who directed the artillery guns where the Americans were located and asking them to stop. The note that was put in the canister on Cher Ami's left leg simply said:

"We are along the road parallel to 276.4. Our own artillery is dropping a barrage directly on us. For heaven's sake, stop it."

As Cher Ami tried to fly back home, the Germans saw her rising out of the brush and opened fire. For several minutes, bullets zipped through the air all around her. For a minute it looked like the little pigeon was going to fall, that she wasn't going to make it. The doomed American infantrymen were crushed, their last hope was plummeting to earth against a very heavy attack from German bullets.

Somehow Cher Ami managed to spread her wings and start climbing again, higher and higher beyond the range of the enemy guns. The little bird flew 25 miles in only 25 minutes to deliver its message. The shelling stopped, and more than 200 American lives were saved, all because the little bird would never quit trying.

#### **District Cross Country**

This week saw a number of KLS students take part in the very competitive District Cross Country Championships that was held at Abbots Hill School. Conditions were variable across the two days of competition, but our students showed great resilience to earn some very creditable results. The outstanding performance came from Oliver (11P) who won the Year 11 Boys race by over 300m in a very dominant display of running. Other notable performances came from Ruby (7A) who was 5<sup>th</sup> in the Year 7 Girls, Rob (7G) who was 9<sup>th</sup> in the Year 7 Boys, Lewis (8C) who was 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Year 8 Boys, Grace (9D) who was 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Year



9 Girls, and William (9P) who was 5<sup>th</sup> in the Year 9 Boys. The Year 8 Boys Team also finished as runners-up in the team trophy. Huge congratulations to all our runners who took part.

#### **PE footwear**

The weather can be unpredictable and as a results we may need to change PE lessons to ensure the safety of our students. Please can you ensure that if your child is on a lesson that requires studded boots (football and rugby) that they also have trainers with them each day they have PE. In addition, as the field gets softer it is essential that your child has boots for football and rugby. One of our Year 8 students (Sienna 8J) competed in a National Ice-Skating competition last week.


The competition was called Young Stars 2022 and only elite skaters from across the UK were invited to the event in Sheffield.

## **FoKLS NEWS**

The Friends are a group of parents and staff who provide fundraising opportunities for the school and social events for all to get involved with. Each term there is a particular focus, the Christmas market, the quiz, a car boot sale, or a celebration of the arts. On set days each term, the Friends run a second hand uniform shop from donations received, of both PE kit and school uniform. We also run fundraising stalls at the annual summer carnival on Kings Langley common and the Christmas lights switch on in Kings Langley High Street. There is steady income to the school by being a member of the school lottery, shopping on Amazon through the 'Amazon button' on our school website and donating unwanted textiles and shoes to our clothing bank, at the entrance to our car park.






