
Technology News

Headcase Concussion Awareness Training

As part of our drive towards increasing the understanding of concussion within sport, the PE Department are asking all of our students to complete the RFU's Headcase Concussion Awareness Training online module. The course will allow students to learn what concussion is, how it looks, and how it feels. Students will see how they can prevent it; look at best practice concussion management and why it is important to why this is followed. Details of the online link will be sent to all students via MS Teams and students will be asked to present their completion certificate to their PE Teacher.

We would also ask that parents/guardians actively consider taking the short course themselves, as well as encouraging their child to complete the training.



Character of the Week

Over this next fortnight, we are focusing on stickability and courage both inside and outside of the classroom. We want students to become more self-motivated and ensure that they are pushing themselves to engage and actively involve themselves in their learning. For the quiet and shy amongst them, this can be difficult but with practise it does get easier to ask a question or offer an answer – but you have to be determined to try it the first time!

For those who struggle to understand a concept or topic, it can be concerning to put yourself above the parapet and ask for help, as you do not want to look silly or stupid in front of your peers. Just remember the likelihood, is that if you do not understand something, it is equally likely that someone else in the room is having the same issue – but is also scared to say. Be brave and ask – others will thank you, even if it is silently.

Our assembly theme is dyslexia awareness, delivered by Mrs Johnson-Putt. We hope students will understand what dyslexia is and what it feels like to be dyslexic when you are surrounded by other students in a classroom. We want to impress the courage and stickability that people with dyslexia have to face on a daily basis, and how they find strategies that help them cope with tasks that to others are simple and everyday ones.

Everyone has something that can prevent them from learning if they choose to argue the fact. It takes courage and stickability to learn properly and get the most out of your learning, but ultimately the more you challenge yourself, the more you will gain form the experience, both inside and outside of the classroom.

James Martin is one of the world's most successful TV chefs even though he was given failing grades at cooking school for not being able to write



down all the details of his recipes. Fortunately for him and those who enjoy his food, he stuck with it and went to one of the top catering colleges in the United Kingdom.

Today, he has a popular BBC Cooking show, over a dozen best-selling cookbooks, several

restaurants, and has developed a personal cookware line that's helped him to amass a multimillion dollar fortune.

When he first began presenting on television, he also found that he struggled reading off the teleprompter. The producer of his show sent him to a dyslexia specialist and he discovered that although he has difficulty standing and reading, what he can do is walk and talk! He has also conditioned himself to read the teleprompter silently and memorise it – then say it as he remembers it.

Even publishing cookbooks is not easy for him as he has to use a Dictaphone. Today James says that he believes his dyslexia drove him to success. At the age of 8, he already knew he wanted to be a chef and he held on to that dream in spite of everything.




