Dear Parents and Guardians,

Last year we successfully examined Kings Langley School students in additional foreign languages. Many of these students went on to achieve the highest grades in languages as varied as Italian, Turkish, Polish, German and Chinese.

This year we would like to expand the program of community languages so that more and more of our young people have the best possible opportunities for academic and professional development. For some of our students, gaining a GCSE in their native language provides a boost to their confidence and helps with the development of their character.

For Kings Langley School students who are native speakers of any of the following languages, and who are currently in years 10 or 11, we can offer the opportunity to sit the GCSE this academic year in any of the languages listed below. Exam boards are listed in brackets;

Italian (AQA), Chinese (AQA), German (AQA), Polish (AQA), Bengali (AQA), Urdu (AQA), Punjabi (AQA), Modern Hebrew (AQA), Turkish (Edexcel), Arabic (Edexcel), Greek (Edexcel), Portuguese (Edexcel), Persian (Edexcel), Russian (Edexcel), Japanese (Edexcel), Gujarati (Edexcel).

For clarity, we are not offering to teach any of the subjects listed here. This opportunity is only open to students who speak an additional language at home and are currently in year 10 or year 11. We intend to repeat this offer to students in the forthcoming years.

In order to complete a GCSE in any of the languages listed above, you will also be required to provide the name of a suitable native speaking adult (a non-relation of the student) who would be willing to;

- · Attend training on the conduct of speaking examinations.
- · Conduct speaking examinations on behalf of Kings Langley School.






Last weeks answer:
