### A note from the Deputy Head & Learning Area Leader for PE

**Dear Parents** 

We are delighted to advise you that the construction of the 3G football pitch is now complete. There are several legal and planning matters to be finalised prior to its use, but we will start playing on the surface during the next half term.

As the 3G pitch is a technical surface we must ensure that we use it correctly. The most important element of correct usage is the footwear students will need to wear whilst on the pitch. Football will be a component of our PE Curriculum; therefore it will be essential for your child to have the appropriate **round plastic-studded** style of football boots.

Students who would like to play on the surface during lunchtime will need to bring a pair of **round plastic-studded** style football boots with them to change into each lunchtime. Trainers or school shoes **will not** be permitted to be worn on the pitch at any time.

We are very conscious that if your child does not have a pair of round plastic- studded style football boots already this is an additional cost for parents. We have therefore set up a collaboration with a local charity called 'One Impossible Thing'. The charity will be able to provide parents with the appropriate footwear if needed free of charge, the contact email address is contact@1impossiblething.com.




#### What we do

We work in West Herts and Luton to redistribute the shoes through youth groups, schools, refugee groups and charitable organisations.




#### How you can help
