Introducing the Mental Health Support Team:

The Mental Health Support Team (MHST) is a pilot scheme commissioned by the Government in conjunction with the NHS to work in educational settings across Hertfordshire to support children/young people/parents and carers with their emotional wellbeing. We are proud to be one of the schools selected to participate in this pilot. A trainee Mental Health Practitioner will be working in collaboration with school staff to help our students to succeed and achieve their full potential by providing a range of services.

Interventions offered by the MHST are evidence based and tailored to the individual needs of each setting. The MHST use a combination of cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) strategies and guided self-help for mild to moderate mental health to support children and young people.

We were delighted to welcome our trainee Miss Hammond early in November, who will be joining us one day a week to complement further our existing in-school provision.

Whilst she is training, and for the remainder of this academic year we will be making referrals for this support internally as her capacity will be extremely limited. Parents who have already sought input from their GP and are interested in referring their child for emotional support from the school should continue to liaise with the appropriate Key Stage office in the first instance to discuss the support that school may be able to offer.

GOVOX:

We have also recently signed up to trial an online wellbeing platform called GOVOX, which offers all of our students the opportunity to complete a periodic wellbeing survey.

Students are invited to check in on a digital device and answer a series of short, friendly questions. This takes less than two minutes and is simple to engage with.

Check-in results on the GOVOX wellbeing dashboard instantly highlights to school staff those who may benefit from some support, enabling our pastoral teams to initiate the conversations that matter.

After each check in, the participant will receive their own personal wellbeing report, which offers proven wellbeing techniques tailored to their specific answers.

The GOVOX platform provides the end user (whether a student or staff member), with actionable insights and resources, whilst teachers and staff are given knowledge and tools to connect and offer appropriate wellbeing support.




STEM Challenge

This week's challenge: Answer next week.

Four cars come to a four-way stop, all coming from a different



direction. They can't decide who got there first, so they all go forward at the same time. They do not crash into each other, but all four cars go. How is this possible?



Answer next week.

Last weeks Answer:

Four people arrive at a river with a narrow bridge that can only hold two people at a time. It's night ime and they have one torch that has to be used when crossing the bridge. Person A can cross the bridge in one minute, B in two minutes, C in five minutes, and D in eight minutes. When two people cross the bridge together, they must move at the slower person's pace. Can they all get across the bridge in 15 minutes or less?

Answer: Yes, they can cross in exactly


15 minutes. The group of four must follow these three steps:

- 1. First, A and B cross the bridge and A brings the light back. This takes 3 minutes.
- 2. Next, C and D cross and B brings the light back. This takes another 10 minutes.
- 3. Finally, A and B cross again.

 This takes another 2 minutes.
