A note from the Deputy Headteacher - Mrs Sudbury

In my previous [newsletter article](#) in December, I shared information about the Year 11 and 13 trial exams and a suggested revision model that students might find helpful in structuring their revision, consisting of **Prioritise**® **Consolidate**® **Memorise**® **Apply**.

This week, we are turning our focus to arrangements for the exam period and some additional resources that students may find helpful in their revision and exam preparation.

be rescheduled.

- Information about study leave - and other important dates - is being shared with Year 11 and 13 parents and students in a separate letter being emailed this week.
- We know that social media is a big part of many students' lives but it is very important that they understand what's allowed/what's not allowed when using social media in their revision and exam preparation. To support this, the *Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ)* has produced an infographic which can be accessed by clicking on the image below or using this link: <https://www.jcq.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/2024/05/JCQ-Social-Media-Infographic-v6.pdf>.

Students must not use social media to:

- **buy/ask for/share exam or assessment content;**
- **pass on rumours of what's in exams or assessments;**
- **share their work; or**
- **work with others so that their exam or assessment is not their own independent work.**

Doing any of these activities could result in a written warning; loss of marks; being disqualified from a part of, or all of, their qualifications; or being banned from taking exams and assessments for a number of years.

JCQ Information for candidates
Using social media and examinations/assessments

While we like to share our experiences online, when it comes to exams and other assessments, we have to be careful.

- Sharing ideas online can be helpful when you're studying or revising
- However, sharing certain information (see information on the right) can break the rules and could affect your results
- If you're not sure what you can and can't discuss online, check with your teacher
- If you receive exam content on social media, you must tell your teacher
- Don't be caught out by scammers selling fake exam papers

Things to do on social media:

- Have fun
- Be responsible
- Report any exam or assessment content you see to your teacher

Things not to do on social media:

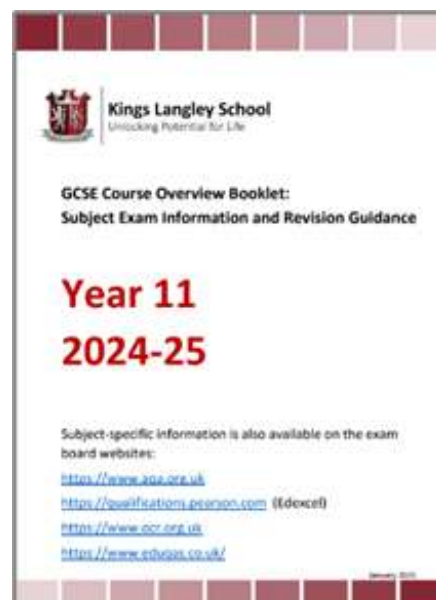
- Buy/ask for/share exam or assessment content
- Pass on rumours of what's in exams or assessments
- Share your work
- Work with others so that your assessment is not your own independent work

If you do any of the above activities, you may:

- Receive a written warning
- Lose marks
- Be disqualified from a part of or all of your qualifications
- Be banned from taking exams and assessments for a number of years

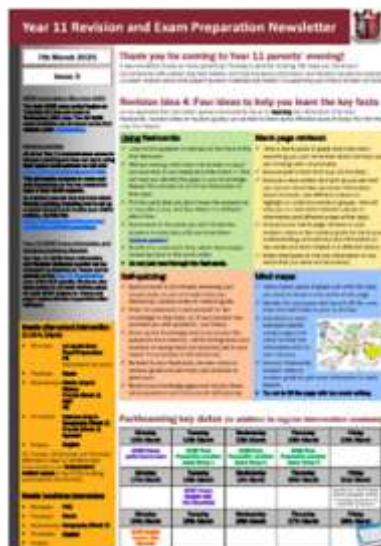

- Year 11 students have been provided with a paper copy of our **GCSE Subject Exam Information and Revision Guidance booklet** and this can also be accessed on the school website: <https://www.kls.herts.sch.uk/assets/Year-11-Exam-Information-and-Revision-Guidance-Booklet-2024-25.pdf>. The aim of this booklet is to ensure that students are confident about the dates and formats of the exams in each subject and to provide them with links to useful revision websites and other resources that they might find helpful to support their revision.



- Year 11 students also have access to 13-week revision plans in every subject that break down the GCSE course into weekly chunks with the aim of giving students confidence that, if they tick off each section, they will have revised the whole course by the time their exams begin. Students can access electronic versions of these, which include links to relevant revision sites and past exam papers/mark schemes, on MS Teams using their usual school log-in: [13-Week Subject Revision Plans 2025](#).

- To provide parents and students with additional guidance, we are producing a weekly **Year 11 Revision and Exam Preparation newsletter** which is emailed to parents on a Friday afternoon. This contains information about weekly lunchtime and after-school intervention sessions, forthcoming key dates and revision ideas. We hope that you find it helpful. A reminder that tickets are still available for our fundraising quiz on Saturday 29th March, 7 for 7:30pm.

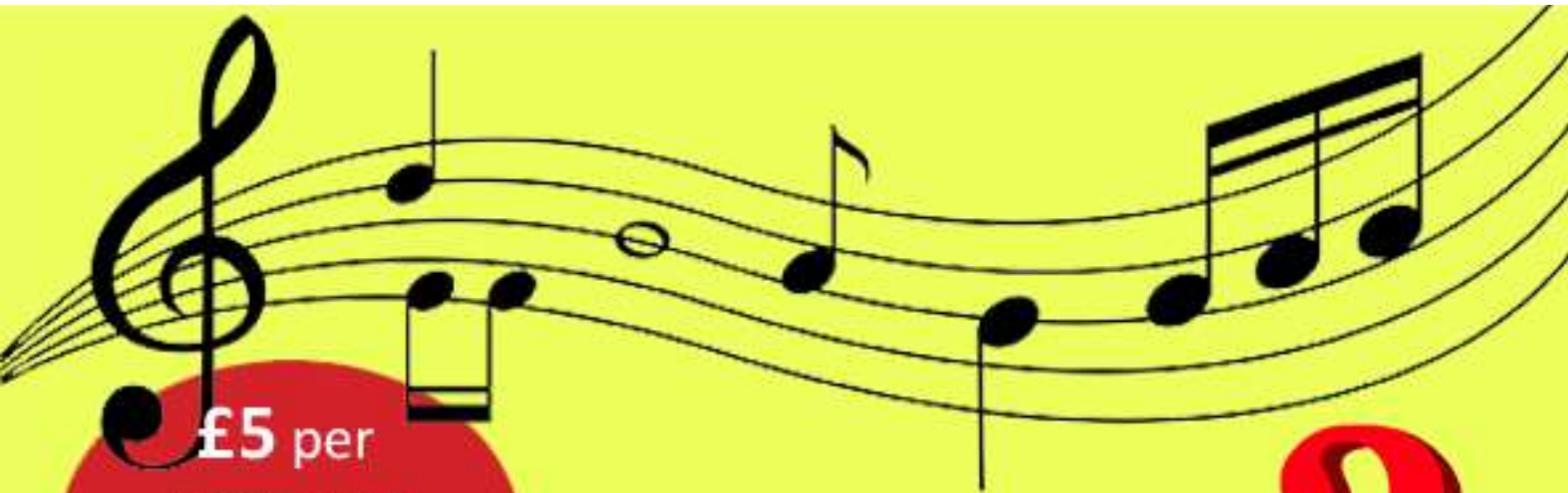

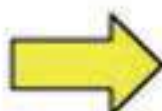

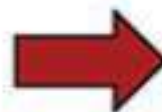

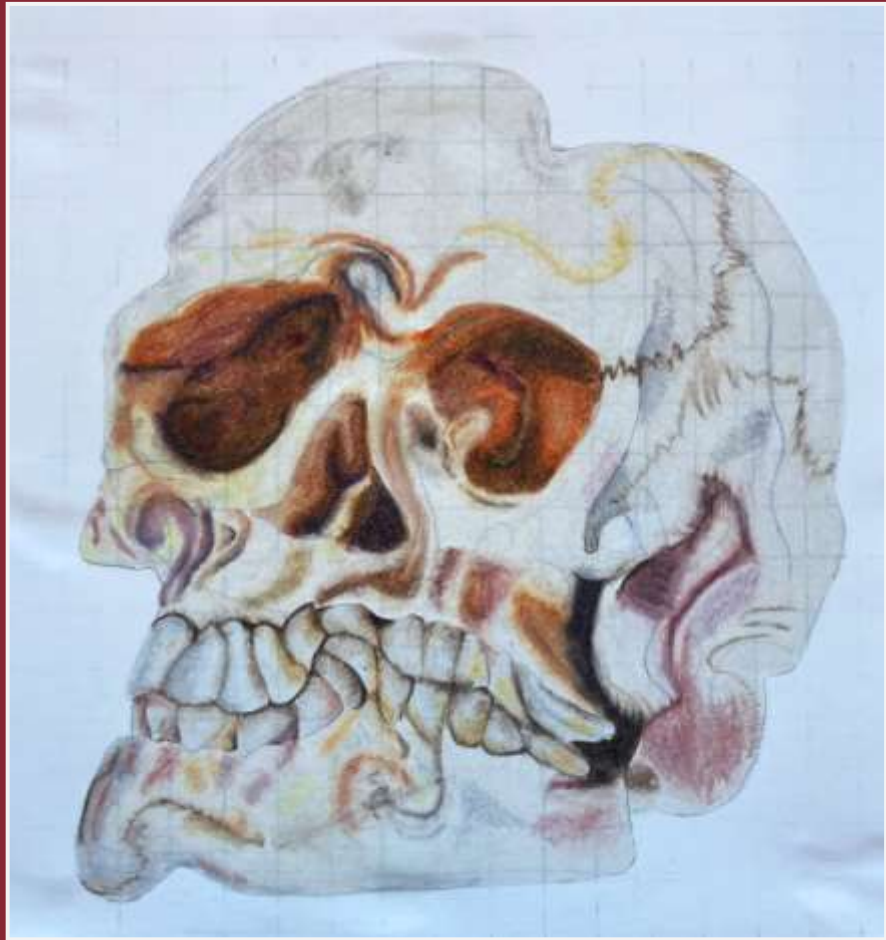


Cross Country

Charity being an important element of not only Ramadan but also our ethos at Kings Langley School, ticket sales and donations will go to the **'Save The Children'** charity.

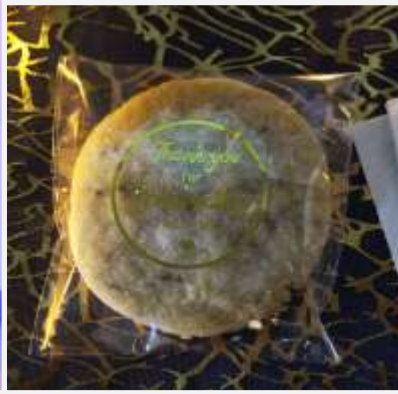
Finally, I would like to say a huge thank you to the following people;

BECAUSE EVIDENCE MATTERS

This week on 20th March, we celebrate **UN International Day of Happiness**. The day recognises the importance and relevance of happiness as a goal and it also seeks to encourage equitable economic growth that promotes the wellbeing of all people.

So much of what we do as adults in the lives of children is aimed at promoting their happiness, but we also know it is not always easy to achieve or sustain.

Happiness is linked to cognitive flexibility, which is a learned skill. Tooled Up has a number of resources to help you to support your child's wellbeing and emotional literacy so that they can reflect and work on their own happiness.

A great place to start **for children of all ages** is for them to consider the different aspects of their wellbeing. Our **Happiness Checklist** activity will help them **identify the positives and any gaps** where things could be better.

For teenagers, My Wellbeing Journal provides a tool to encourage reflection on experiences and achievements in order to build resilience. Completed over a two-week period, **the activity helps children to develop and maintain a positive mindset** and improve wellbeing.

The **A-Z of Tooled Up Tips for Supporting Children's Mental Health and Wellbeing** showcases **26 evidence based key tips**. The resource includes **links to a host of webinars, podcasts and activities** available on the **Tooled Up platform to help in everyday family life.**

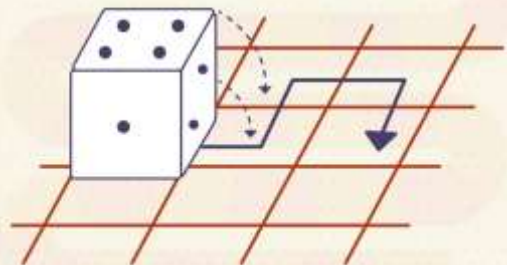
