A Note from the Headteacher

As you will be aware from the news, the National Education Union (NEU) have announced their intention to proceed with further formal Industrial Action on the following remaining days during the spring term:

Wednesday 1 March Wednesday 15 March Thursday 16 March

The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over the level of funding schools receive along with terms and conditions for staff amongst other matters. The disagreement is not with Kings Langley School, with our staff stating this to our leadership team, but we will be affected by the strike on the dates above.

On the first date on 1st February 2023, we were able to have more known in our planning but the action is increasing in staffing levels on the days above. We have a number of staff who are members of the NEU who did not strike on day 1 but are now likely to take action and could decide that they will support the industrial action and make themselves unavailable

for work on all or some of the identified days. Colleagues do not have to share their intention with the school which will make it difficult to safely plan our provision for 1200 students.

I would like to share with you our plans for students here at Kings Langley School for the final three days of strike actions in the spring term:

Year 11 and Year 13 students are in their final term before completing their exams and I will therefore, endeavour to maintain routine and practice for these cohorts across the entire dates as stated in my previous letter and as such for our onsite provision we will invite into school Year 11, 12 and 13.

All other year groups will move to online learning set via Microsoft TEAMs for the remaining dates above.

I ask that all cohorts in school bring with them their usual equipment and maintain the school uniform expectations during these dates. Those at home are to log on and try and follow a normal school routine within the MS TEAMs platform. Work and activities will be set either by non-striking teachers or members of the leadership team.

I once again state that teachers in school cannot cover for those colleagues who are on strike and as such we will only know on the day in question how we will cover all the lessons in school by the routes above.

Vulnerable Students - are permitted to attend school and a provision will be in place in the library and Learning Resources Centre staffed by Mrs Finlay and Ms Hill. If you require this provision please complete the following form by 9am on 28th February 2023.

Summary of year group information:

Year 11 - should attend school. Students will attend lessons as normal with non-striking teachers in school or be taught by senior leaders and where possible these will be subject specialists. I did enjoy teaching Year 11 Geography last time and will be again during the dates above.

Year 12 & 13 - should attend school for lessons only. If teachers are not in school, students should report to the Sixth Form Centre and undertake independent study.

For those students attending school, buses will operate as normal. Our food service will be available at normal times.

Years 7, 8, 9, 10 should remain at home for the dates above and follow the work set on Microsoft TEAMs by staff who are not striking or senior staff.

Calendar adjustments (should planned strikes go ahead)

The Online Year 12 Subject Consultation has been rescheduled to Thursday 23 March 2023 from 4.15pm-7.45pm.

The Year 7 Practical Revision Event for Parents has been rescheduled to 16 March 2023 at 6.30pm in the Main School Hall.

I'm sorry that you will have to make alternative arrangements for your child(ren) in Year 7-10 for the remainder of the strike dates and/or that they will experience disruption to their education. I understand that this situation may be frustrating and I ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect.

Kings Langley School remains committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our students and delivering high-quality first teaching. We are working closely with our staff union representatives to keep up to date with the situation and I will inform you as soon as possible if arrangements change further.











Spanish Valentines Cards



Cookery Club

Chocolate Cup Cakes

Ingredients

115g butter, softened

115g caster sugar

2 medium eggs, lightly beaten

1tsp vanilla extract

90g self-raising flour

25g cocoa powder

1-2tbsp milk



Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/350F/Fan 160C/Gas Mark 4. Line a 12-hole bun tray with 12 paper cases.
- 2. Place the butter and sugar in a mixing bowl and beat together until very pale and fluffy. Gradually beat in the eggs, a spoonful at a time. Beat well after each addition and if the mixture begins to curdle add a spoonful of the measured flour.
- 3. Beat in the vanilla extract then sift over the flour and cocoa powder and fold in gently with a metal spoon. Fold in enough of the milk to get a soft dropping consistency. Divide the mixture between the paper cases. Bake for 15-20mins until risen, golden and springy to the touch.
- 4. Leave the fairy cakes in the tray for about 5mins then transfer to a cooling rack and leave to cool completely.








Audition Details

If you want to audition as a dancer, you will be taught a short sequence to perform. Please bring PE kit to change into and be prepared to stay until 5pm










