Eva (12SHH) started the day with a very creditable $8^{\text {th }}$ place in the Senior Girls Elite competition. This was followed up with Alex (9P) winning the Intermediate boys elite competition, Michael (11C) winning the senior boys novice event, and our senior boys novice team (Michael 11C, Tom 11A, Max 11C) dominating their competition with a clean sweep of the medals. All four boys now qualify for the Zonal Finals (the best trampolinists from the South of England) after Christmas.
