Study Leave

Many students and parents have been asking about study leave and when this is given to students. Full guidance and our policy on study leave can be found on **page 44** of the Sixth Form handbook but in summary:

- Students in Yr12 are not given study leave. This is consistent with the majority of post-16 settings.
- Students in Yr13 are only given study leave for their final, terminal examinations which take place in Summer.

Students are advised that subject areas are not to issue homework or independent work, other than examination preparation, one week prior to examination periods and during these periods.

Please refer to the guidance in the Sixth Form handbook for the full rationale of this. Students should also be aware of the impact of absence during the examination period.

Dress Code

As a Sixth Form, we believe our dress code allows our students to express themselves as individuals and is a reflection of contemporary working practice where people that wear suits and formal wear are in decline. We do however, require our students to be dressed appropriately for a Sixth Form studying environment. Dressing appropriately shows that you are committed to working with the Sixth Form values and wish to be considered as an adult with the aspirations for success.

Students are also reminded that whilst we have our own building, we still have our lessons and other activities in the main school building where our younger people are required to adhere to a uniform policy. Our Sixth Formers are therefore role models to our younger students.

A reminder that students are not permitted to wear trainers (unless for medical reasons, supported with a medical note), and must not wear hoodies in the main school building. We appreciate that some weather conditions may necessitate more appropriate footwear and additional layers and it is perfectly acceptable to wear these items into Sixth Form however, they must be removed once students have arrived to Sixth Form.

Parent & Carers Engagement Forum

Kings Langley Sixth Form

As a Sixth Form we have a Parent and Carers Engagement Forum where we invite parents and carers of students currently in the sixth form, to be part of the continuous development and progression of the sixth form.

The purpose of this forum is to increase the opportunity for parents and carers to be part of the consultation and development of sixth form policies, as well as identify how parents and carers may want to contribute to the sixth form provision. It will also offer an additional form of communication between the sixth form team and home.

These informal forum meetings will be chaired by Mr Tubb, Head of Sixth Form, and parents and carers are invited to attend as frequently as they wish; membership is not required, and contributions are entirely discretionary. Each forum has a focus and enables the sixth form to inform parents about our approach and rationale behind policies and procedures. Parents and carers can also identify areas that they wish the sixth form to consider or explore.

Next meeting agenda—Examination preparation and support, fund-raising, and identifying ways of supporting young people with the demands of today's society.

We advocate positive, future-orientated discussions at these meetings and focus on how improvements can be made across the sixth form community whilst remaining entirely student-centred. This forum is not for individual student issues or concerns, and we politely ask that these are directed to the appropriate member of the sixth form team in the normal manner.

Young Carers

Mrs Battaglia has been working with Mrs Rennick (Yr10 Pastoral Leader) to ensure that our students who play a vital and important caring role at home, are recognised and get the support that they need.

A questionnaire went out to Sixth Form students and we hope that we have captured the information we need to put in place, advice, guidance and support.

We wish to communicate to our students and people at home, that they should not feel worried about perceived stigma or that we will be intrusive. Our intention is to provide the support that can make life easier and consequently, make us more understandable with challenges or impact on studying or aspects such as punctuality.

Off-Site, Self-Supported Study

From January Yr12 students will be able to access off-site, self-supported study from 12.50pm (if they do not have lessons period 5 or 6, and if there are no scheduled activities or events). This is dependent on meeting the off-site, self-supported study criteria (see page 23-24 of the Sixth Form Handbook Student Handbook & Guidance Kings Langley Secondary School - Unlocking Potential for US (kts Berts self-ust)) for further information.

Students are reminded that they can only access this if they have returned a hand-signed permission slip. Email and digital permissions are not accepted.

Students in Yr12 are only granted this privilege if there are no concerns with regards to attainment, progress, attendance and/or punctuality. Students and people at home are advised to read through the guidance in the Sixth Form Handbook – link above.


