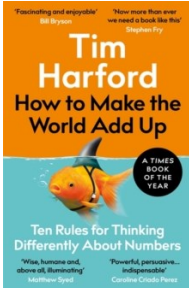

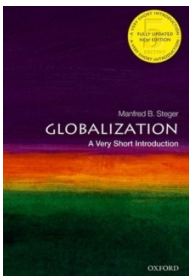

How To Make The World Add Up by Tim Harford



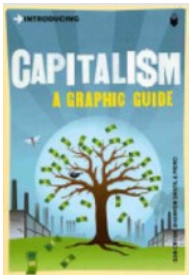
What should we do when someone makes a claim that they say is based on hard data? This book discusses the factors we need to consider.

Globalization: a very short introduction by M.B. Steger



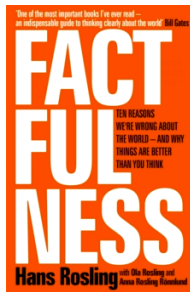

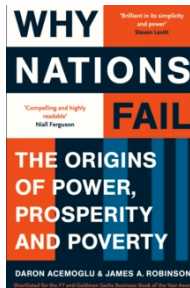
An illustrated history of the remarkable rise of capitalism, from its beginnings to the present day.

When asked simple questions about global trends - why the world's population is increasing; how many young women go to school; how many of us live in poverty - we routinely get the answers wrong. Why?



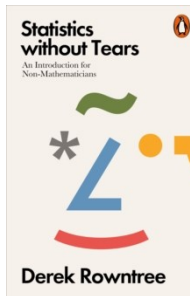
Why Nations Fail by Daron Acemoglu and J A Robinson

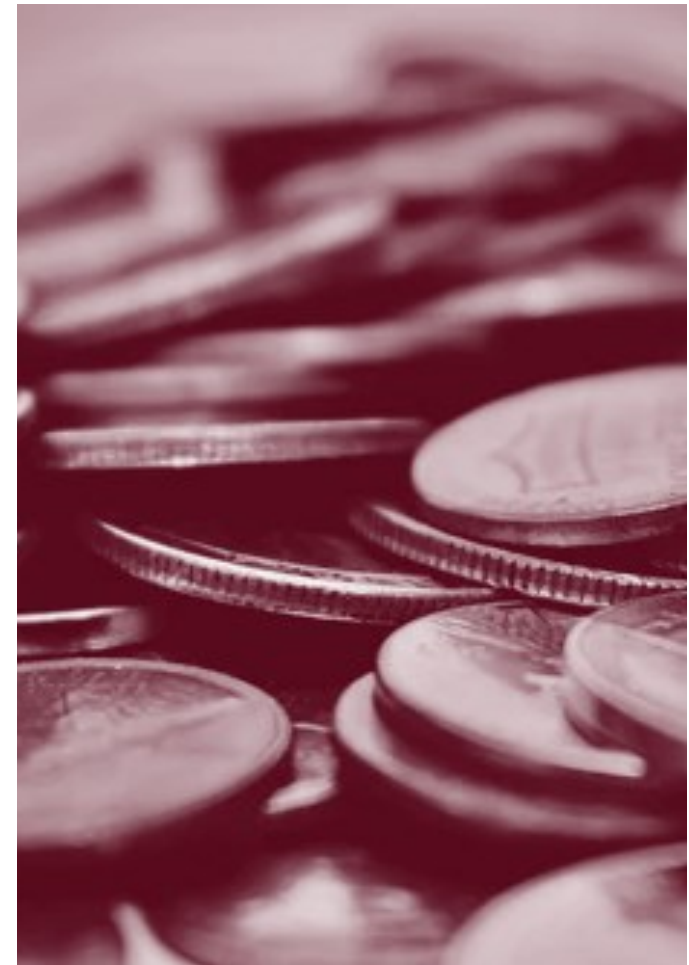

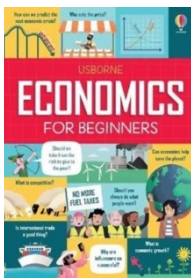

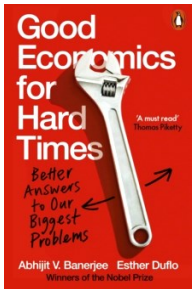

Aimed at younger readers, this is an ideal book to dip into for a refresher on key topics.

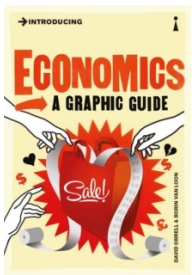


Good Economics for Hard Times by Abhijit V. Banerjee

Makes a case that economics, when done right, can help us solve the thorniest social and political problems of our day.

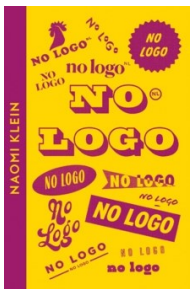
Economics: a Graphic Guide by David Orrell

No Logo by Naomi Klein

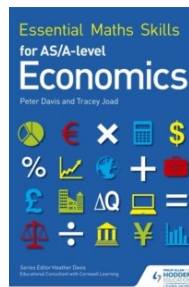

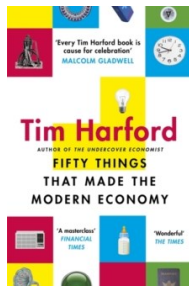

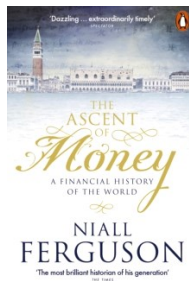

First published in 1973, this controversial study looks at the economic structure of the western world in a revolutionary way.



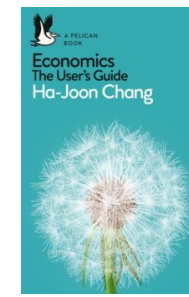
The Ascent of Money by Niall Ferguson

A study of the history of money, from boom to bust, and triumph to disaster.



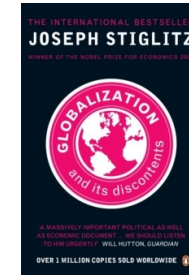
The Establishment by O. Jones

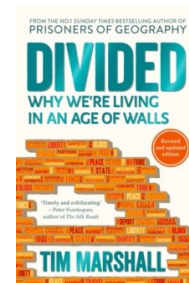
