





Apprenticeships

What to expect, apprenticeship levels, salaries and more. Learn all you need to know about our apprenticeships.

How apprenticeships work

Apprenticeships provide you with on-the-job training and responsibilities from day one. You'll spend 20% of your time working towards an industry recognised professional qualification.

The combination of work and learning allows you to develop your learning through practical experience. We'll invest in your training and pay you at the same time.

Once you complete your apprenticeship, you'll have all the relevant knowledge to progress in your chosen field.

What the starting salaries are

We offer varying starting salaries from:

Level 2 and 3: £25,294 / London Underground: £26,961

Level 4: £26,559
Level 5: £27,887
Level 6: £29,281

Who can start an apprenticeship

You must have the <u>Right to Work in the UK</u> for the duration of your apprenticeship and have lived in the UK/ EEA for the past 3 years.

Before you can start an apprenticeship you must be 18 years old. You may be 16 years old for some roles. There is no upper age limit.

The majority of our schemes require a minimum of 2 or more GCSEs for an applicant to be eligible. However, some of our schemes have no formal entry requirements at all!

Where qualifications are required, applicants can still be studying towards these, so long as they meet the entry requirements by the start date.

From Level 2 through to Degree apprenticeships and with so many career pathways and training opportunities available, TfL will help you transform your future and we'll be with you all the way.

You can only apply for one apprenticeship scheme per year.

Levels of apprenticeship

We offer four types of apprenticeships:

- Intermediate Apprenticeships or Level 2: Equivalent to GCSEs
- Advanced Apprenticeships or Level 3: Equivalent to A Levels
- Higher Apprenticeships or Level 4 and Level 5: Equivalent to a foundation degree and above
- Degree Apprenticeships or Level 6: Equivalent to a degree

Higher level apprenticeships tend to have higher entry requirements. If you have a degree, you cannot apply for an apprenticeship that is related to your current degree.

For example, you cannot apply for a finance apprenticeship with a finance degree. If your degree is in an unrelated subject, you can apply for an apprenticeship.

What you'll get

At the end of each programme, our apprentices get professional qualifications.

They vary depending on the role. For example, for the London Underground Fleet Apprenticeship, you'll achieve a Rail Engineering Technician qualification.

If you're on Finance level 4, you'll gain a qualification in **Business Accounting** accredited by **CIMA**.

If you do Building Services level 6, you'll get a Building Services Engineering qualification. This is accredited by the Chartered Institution of Building Services Engineers (CIBSE).

Application process

There are three stages:

- 1. **Online application:** It's where you enter your personal details and select the programme you want to apply for.
- 2. **Online test:** This test helps us (and you) to identify your key strengths and understand if they align to our strengths and values.
- 3. **Assessment centre:** It varies by role but may include an interview, a technical question, a test, a group task or a presentation. We'll provide more details nearer the assessment centre date, so you have time to prepare.

If you want to apply for an apprenticeship, graduate or intern role, follow our step-by-step application guide.

Application deadlines

Applications for all apprenticeship levels will be open soon. Register your interest to stay updated.

Length of schemes

Apprenticeships' length varies depending on the level. They usually last from 18 months to 6 years. Lower levels, for example 2, 3 and 4 are between 2-3 years.

Level 6 takes around 5 years to complete, as apprentices attend university and study towards a degree.

Our locations

All the apprenticeship roles are London based with our main offices being in Southwark, North Greenwich, and Stratford. Your working location may vary and will depend upon your scheme, placement or job requirement. You can still apply if you live outside of London. Your place of residence is not considered in the application.

Education providers

We have made agreements with training providers for each of our schemes so these vary depending on the scheme that you are on.

What we cover

Our apprentices don't pay towards their apprenticeships. We cover all training and qualification costs and apprentices' salary.

What's next for you

The opportunities are endless. We invest in apprentices' development because their growth is our growth. When the programme ends, you'll have the opportunity to secure a permanent position. Some of you may want to progress onto another apprenticeship too. In the long term, you can expand on your knowledge and experience.

What you'll need

- You should already hold or be working towards a minimum of 2 GCSE's A*-C/ grade 4 or above (or equivalent) including Maths and English language.
- You are not eligible for this scheme if you currently hold or undertaking the same Apprenticeship Standard.
- Please note that you will be required to provide original certificates and/or predicted grades as proof for your eligibility checks.
- You must be 18 by 8th September 2025 to be eligible for this scheme.

Job overview

Our Fleet Engineers at London Underground play a vital role in maintaining and upgrading the operational efficiency and safety of our rolling stock. As a Fleet Engineer, your responsibility is crucial in maintaining our entire fleet of trains.

You will be up-to-date of the latest developments, ensuring our assets, both new and legacy, consistently operate at optimal levels. This role is pivotal in the continuous performance and safety of our transportation system.

What you'll be doing

As a London Underground Fleet Apprentice, you'll undertake up to seven placements at our train care depots across London.

After receiving high quality classroom and on-the-job training from the fleet's dedicated trainers, you'll work alongside skilled train engineers and maintainers to learn how our various train systems work.

London Underground rolling stock has long since ceased to be 'clunk click' and is now a highly sophisticated piece of equipment requiring a raised level of technical competence to maintain it.

Under constant supervision, and working as part of a team, you'll learn and become proficient in both mechanical and electrical skills.

That'll help you contribute to the maintenance and fault repair of our varied rolling stock, ensuring a fast turn around and playing your part in keeping London moving.

Where this career can take you

Upon successful completion of this scheme, you could roll-off into a Train maintainer position which could lead to further career development opportunities such as Advanced Train Maintainer or Team leader positions. At the end of the apprenticeship, you'll be at an Engineering Technician professional standard while there's no need this can be built upon to achieve Chartership status in the future.

You'll also have opportunities to complete extra training courses. These will vary from soft skills training to technical skills training.
