STEM IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION-THE READY TRIAL

The PE department were delighted to welcome Hertfordshire University to Kings Langley to work with students ranging from Year 8 to Year 11. The University introduced students to The Ready Trial, a research programme for students with low mood and depression, to see if physical activity can improve mood. Students took part in a range of activities and gained valuable experience in the use of advanced technology in sport. Students used speed gates to measure their speed over 10m and 20m distances and tested their explosive strength using jump pads to measure jump height and air time. The university allowed students to administer the tests so they understood how to work the technology. Finally students explored their pulse rates and how they changed during different levels of exercise. The results were compared to their maximum and resting heartrates. Students compared results against their peers and were able to try and improve their scores against their previous results.


