GOLF-JACK 8A

Jack has played golf since he was four and is very keen on training and the process of developing his golf on and off the course.

Last season, Jack entered all the events within the Hertfordshire Future Tour. The aim was to increase his experience and have plenty of fun so it was quite a unexpected bonus to bring home three trophies across two divisions followed by another trophy at Chesfield Downs entering the Hertfordshire Record Books in the Hall Of Fame Birdie Twos Club.

Having completed his winter training which was a minimum of 5-7 hours weekly, he commenced this season ready to substantially increase his hours. The next stage which was the Hertfordshire ITour and played all over the county with a full season of seven matches. This tour has its own handicap system and Jack progressed from Division 2 up to Division 1.

At the Start of this season, Jack was selected to train with the Hertfordshire County Emerging Players which is a subsidised training programme at Brockett Hall as an addition to his three times a week group and individual term time coaching commitments at Knebworth and Mill Green.

During the Season Jack improved his Hertfordshire County and England Golf Handicap Rating allowing him to qualify for entry into his home Knebworth Clubs Summer Junior Events Schedule which run twice or three times a week over 18 holes during the Summer Holidays. He achieved second place in the Jubilee Salver and Jack Mudd Trophy finishing the season at 27.2 handicap.

After a full diary of competitions completed, he was successful enough to be invited to play in the Order of Merit I Tour Final where he competed with the other season winners and collected a trophy his performance at one of the earlier matches played at Whipsinade Golf Club.

Additional to his coaching hours are the match plays. He, fully attended all of the weekly after school Knebworth Junior Club Roll Ups this Spring, Summer & Autumn under the Direction Of Matt Clarke. Jack won nine out of eleven sessions and has continued to average in the top five for the remaining six autumn sessions before the light has faded and ended the season this week. All in all in total with the tours and club events and roll ups he has completed about 40 organised events. He has had so much fun reaching his goal of breaking 100 and 90 and now is chasing breaking 80. He even managed to get another Birdie at Essendon and Aldenham Golf Club which really was fun to watch!

It's been a great journey and process and Jack has broadened his friendships and also seen the rewards but also built resilience through the tougher matches and challenges of the seasons weather. This Winter his Long Term Individual Coach Mark Day has invited him to join his own Single Digit Club squad as another addition to his training hours with the ambition to work towards a single digit handicap in the next two years.

Jack is a passionate and ambitious golfer which is clear for all to see. We wish jack every success in his golfing endeavours and we are looking forward to tracking your progress.
