It has been another successful term for our girls' football teams, as they continue to outshine the boys.

- Our U/12 Girls reached the County Semi-Final, losing narrowly 2-3 in a very closely fought fixture. They have had an excellent debut season, with many of the girls playing up a year for the U/13s.
- The U/13 Girls reached the County Quarter Final and also won the Hertfordshire Women's International Day 7-a-side Tournament held at Adeyfield School after remaining unbeaten throughout.
- The U/14 Girls reached the County Semi-Final and lost narrowly 2-3, but won the Hertfordshire Futsal Champi-

onships after remaining unbeaten. Daisy (9C) was also voted MVP of the whole Tournament.

• Our U/15 Girls remain in the National Cup after winning their last game 11-0, and travel to Kent to play their Last 32 game after Easter. Our U/16 Girls reached the County Quarter Final, with a number of girls playing for the school for the first time.


