Careers - Did you know...?

- We offer your child career interviews in Years 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13.
- In addition, all Year 12 students will be given a 'Mock Interview' with a representative from an outside organisation
- We ask your child every six months to update their plans and careers thoughts.
- We use this to direct them towards personalised careers advice such as our Monday careers assemblies.
- Every subject, every term, in every year group will introduce the students to a career or job linked to the subject or topic that the teacher is teaching.
- We offer students the opportunity to experience a one week work placement in Year 10 and Year 12
- We insist as per DFE guidelines that this work experience opportunity is completed.

- Students (with parents/carers) will take ownership of process to find own placement




Application process...own placement

- Students will need to use 'Placements Tool' on UNIFROG
- Agree a placement with an employer
- Complete the first page Student Initial Form
- Once finished and added this will generate an email trail between the student/employer/parent/school
