

## Year 7 April/May 2024 Exams – Overview

Activities in PE change each five weeks, with short practical assessments taking place at the end of this period. There is therefore no single examination in PE, with the 'Exam Grade' on reports based on average performance across each recent assessment.

Exam grades in Art are based on continual assessments of students' work across lessons and there is therefore no single Exam scheduled for these subjects.

Exam grades in Music are based on continual assessments of students' practical work, and baseline and End of Unit Tests across lessons and there is therefore no single Exam scheduled.

English	Two 40 minute exams. Reading comprehension paper based on two non- fiction texts Writing paper. Non-Fiction writing task.	Non- Fiction reading comprehension. Non-Fiction writing (Letter task)	Students are encouraged to read a range of non-fiction either from the library or as their own school reader and to read this either alone or aloud to someone at home. A practice paper for non- fiction reading comprehension will be done in class and students may take their books home to revise.
Maths	Test Format: Two 40 minutes tests, one non-calculator and one calculator paper. Each paper is worth 50 marks. Students are expected to bring their own equipment including a scientific calculator.	Topics covered in the test: Unit 4 – Percentages Unit 5 – Fractions Unit 6 – Introduction to Algebra Unit 7 – Solving Linear Equations in One Variable Unit 8 – Collecting, Organising and Displaying Data	The best way to revise Maths is to Do Maths, the two main resources we use for revision are vle.mathswatch.co.uk and www.kerboodle.com; students can use the "sign in with Microsoft" button to access these. All students have access to a list of topics that gives details about which MathsWatch videos to watch, and which exercises are covered in the 1B book on Kerboodle. This topic list can be found at the bottom of the maths subject page in the learning areas section of the website.

Students will complete regular in class assessments for PRE, there will not be an exam.



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			Class teachers will also set a revision task on MathsWatch and post the topic list on Teams.
Science	One 40 minute paper, worth 60 Marks	Topics covered: Topic 1: How Science Works Topic 2: Energy and particles Topic 3: Separating mixtures Topic 4: Chemical reactions Topic 5: Cells	Ensure that you can confidently answer the core questions in your work booklet. You could write them out, or produce your own glossary, or produce your own knowledge organiser with the whole topic on one page. Ask a family member to ask you the core questions. Make a note of any you got wrong and learn them again. Repeat the above steps until you can easily recall the answers. Look through your previous assessments to find examples of the type of questions you will get in the exam. Your teacher will show you where to find copies of keywords, core questions and answers and Lesson PowerPoints to help you with your revision

You can then update your 'I can statements' with how confident you feel, practicing those you're struggling with more.
